Official Ballot Presidential Preference Vote, Nonpartisan office and Referendum April 5, 2016

Notice to voters: If you are voting on Election Day, your ballot must be initialed by two election inspectors. If you are voting absentee, your ballot must be initialed by the municipal clerk or deputy clerk. Your ballot may not be counted without initials. (See end of ballot for initials.)

General Instructions

If you make a mistake on your ballot or have a question, ask an election inspector for help. (Absentee voters: Contact your municipal clerk.)

To vote for a name on the ballot, complete the arrow next to the name like this .

To vote for a name that is not on the ballot, write the name on the line marked "write-in" and complete the arrow next to the name like this .

Presidential Preference Vote

In the Presidential Preference Vote:

- You may vote in only ONE party's primary.
- You may vote only ONCE.
- If you vote more than once, your choices will not be counted.

Special Instructions for Presidential Preference Vote

Choose the party in which you will vote. Within the party you have chosen, you have ONE of 3 choices:

- Vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot in the party you have chosen.
- Vote for an uninstructed delegation from Wisconsin to the national convention of the party you have chosen.
- Write in the name of another person to become the presidential candidate of the party you have chosen.

QUESTION 1: Shall the City of New London adopt a Resolution which reads as follows?

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court's decisions in Citizens United v. Federal Elections Commission and related case law allows unlimited political campaign spending to influence local, state and federal elections:

BE IT RESOLVED, that "We the People" of the City of New London, Wisconsin, call for reclaiming democracy from the expansion of corporate personhood rights and the corrupting influence of unregulated political contributions and spending. We stand with the Move to Amend campaign and communities across the country supporting passage of an amendment to the United States Constitution stating:

- Only human beings - not corporations, limited liability companies, unions, nonprofit organizations or similar associations - are endowed with Constitutional rights; and
- Money is not speech, and therefore, regulating political contributions and spending is not equivalent to limiting political speech.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we hereby instruct our Federal representatives to enact legislation to advance this effort.

A "Yes" vote on this Resolution would indicate support for a Constitutional Amendment.

A "No" vote would indicate opposition to an Amendment.
