Procedure for Calling State Reps Regarding AJR 92 / SJR 82

Here is a detailed procedure for educating and pinning down our state representatives regarding their position on our resolutions <u>AJR 92</u> and <u>SJR 82</u>. When you click on these links, you can see which representatives have already cosponsored these resolutions. **If your reps aren't on the list please contact them!** Here's how:

1.	For contact information for your representatives, click here.
2.	Give 'em a call. Say something like, Hi, my name is and I'm a volunteer with United To Amend. We're a non-partisan citizens group that's trying to get the big money out of politics. People don't feel like they're being represented anymore. And they're mostly right. We'd like to support AJR 92 / SJR 82. I'd be happy to send you an email with background information that you can give to OK, great. Can I call you in a week to get their reaction?

- b. Do you agree that we need to clarify the words "people" and "speech" in our Constitution, so we can pass reasonable campaign finance laws? If not, why not?
- 5. They may suggest a meeting with the rep or an aide. Set it up and meet them at the capitol if you're in Dane County. If you're not, let Jim know and we'll find someone to meet with them. Also, if they're giving you the run around, **you** may want to suggest a meeting.
