No. 14n -- RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF AMENDING THE U.S. CONSTITUTION TO ENABLE CONGRESS AND THE STATES TO REASONABLY REGULATE CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

TO THE HONORABLE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE BROWN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Ladies and Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, a government of, by and for the people has long been a cherished American value, and free and fair elections are essential to democracy and effective self-government; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin has a tradition of open government and nonpartisan local elections, as well as campaign finance rules that attempt to mitigate the influence of money on those elections, and the people of the State of Wisconsin have a compelling sovereign interest in preventing unknown foreign actors and other entities from spending unlimited sums of money to influence the outcomes of our elections; and

WHEREAS, <u>Political Action Committees</u> ('PACs') that are registered for Federal or State elections are **restricted** in the amounts of money that donors can contribute to the PAC, and in how much an individual PAC can contribute directly to a candidate or a political party. In addition, PACs **must divulge** who their donors are, and what candidates or party the PAC contributed towards; and

WHEREAS, the 1976 U.S. Supreme Court ruling in <u>Buckley v. Valeo</u> declared, in general, that spending money to influence elections is a protected form of speech; and

WHEREAS, the 2010 U.S. Supreme Court ruling in <u>Citizens United v. Federal Election</u> <u>Commission</u> declared, in general, that corporations, labor unions and other organizations may engage in **unrestricted** spending on campaigns by utilizing what are commonly referred to as <u>Super Political Action Committees</u> ('Super PACs') if: a) they don't make contributions directly to candidates or political parties; and b) their spending is done independently of candidates or political parties; and

WHEREAS, <u>Issue Advocacy Groups</u> ('IAGs') are non-profit organizations that may engage in **unrestricted** spending on campaigns and do **not** have to disclose their donors - the money IAGs receive is called 'Dark Money' because the donors are typically unknown. Like Super

PACs, IAGs cannot spend money on campaigns in coordination with candidates or political parties, but IAGs can funnel unlimited amounts of money into Super PACs. While Super PACs must disclose their donors, contributions to Super PACs from IAGs only name the IAGs as the donors, and the original source of the IAGs' Dark Money is not disclosed; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable for the Brown County Board of Supervisors to adopt this Resolution in order to demonstrate its support to have the U.S. Constitution amended in a manner that would enable Congress and the States to once again reasonably regulate campaign finance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Brown County Board of Supervisors hereby expresses its desire to have the U.S. Constitution amended in a manner that would enable Congress and the States to once again reasonably regulate campaign finance, and hereby directs that a copy of this Resolution be emailed to the federal Senators and Congresspersons that represent the State of Wisconsin.
